CODE OF PRACTICE FOR THE WELFARE OF ANIMALS KEPT AS PETS

The **Animals (Welfare and Protection) Ordinance 2016** states that the Director of Natural Resources may from time to time revise or issue Codes of Practice to give practical guidance for the keeping of animals.

Codes exist for the welfare of dogs, sheep, cattle, horses, pigs and for animals during transport. This code intends to give guidance for the general keeping of small pet animals, including back yard poultry.

1. Food and Water

1.1 Food

Animals should have daily access to a diet which is nutritionally adequate to maintain health and meet the appropriate physiological requirements for the species and life stage at which it is in.

Owners should be aware of any specific dietary requirements of the species that they keep as a pet. Some basic feeding guidelines for some species are below:

SPECIES	FEEDING GUIDELINE
Cats	Commercial cat food and raw meat (do not feed kittens exclusively raw meat). Must not be fed a vegetarian or only fish diet as they require taurine which is found in red meat and is added to commercial food.
Guinea pigs	Ad lib access to good quality hay or grass is essential. Supplement diet with commercial guinea pig pellets, leafy greens, green and red pepper, broccoli, tomatoes and oranges. Need a dietary source of vitamin C and although commercial food is supplemented the vitamin C may not remain active in the food for more than 90 days so a supply of fresh food is important. Do not change food types suddenly as they are fastidious in their choice of food.
Rabbits	Ad lib access to good quality hay or grass is essential. Supplement diet with a measured amounts of commercial pellets and/or vegetables (greens, carrots, cabbage and salad crops).
Hamsters	Commercial feed blocks or pellets are better than seed mixes as rodents will select the high fat, low calcium seeds such as sunflower seeds and only eat them which can lead to obesity and osteoporosis. Seeds, grains fruit and green vegetables should be offered as a supplement rather than the main diet.
Caged birds Eg budgies	Commercial diets specific to breed. Need a varied diet but if allowed may just select specific seeds or one type of food so supplements to a commercial diet should be included greens (eg lettuce, watercress, chickweed, parsley), sprouted seeds, vegetables such as carrots, turnip, beetroot and fruit (oranges, apples, plums, grapes). You can make a mash with some of these items with added protein such as cooked egg, cheese or milk.
Poultry	Commercial food suitable for the stage of the bird's life is recommended. Feeding of large amounts of kitchen waste/scraps may attract rodents and adversely affect the hygiene of the area.

1.2 Water

Animals must have ad lib access to water. Daily assessment should be made of the quality and quantity of the water supply.

Mechanical equipment controlling the delivery of water should be inspected regularly, and frequently in hot weather, and be maintained in good working order. It is also essential that a water supply is maintained in freezing weather when pipes, bowls or drinks bottles are liable to freeze up.

The quality of water provided should be adequate to maintain animal health.

2. Protection from Climatic Extremes

All pet animals must have adequate housing that minimises the effects of weather that produces cold or heat stress. Shelter from rain and direct sunlight is necessary.

3. Supervision

Pet animals must have adequate supervision relative to their specific requirements at all times.

4. Housing

4.1 General

All sheds, pens, hutches, kennels, runs and beds should be constructed and maintained so as to minimise stress and injury to the animals.

Objects such as water and feed bowls, doors and gate hinges and latches should be designed and located so as to avoid injury. Sharp projections must be avoided. Rabbits and rodents especially may chew hutches and cages rendering them unsafe.

Housing should be designed to minimise stress or injury and to allow animals space to display normal behaviour specific to their species. Cats must not be confined to cages unless for a medical reason and under the instruction of a veterinary surgeon (or for temporary kennelling). Cats that are kept as indoor cats must have several resource stations and a variety of toys and activities to meet their behavioural needs.

Housing and outside spaces for animals must be maintained in a state of cleanliness and provide an area of dry ground for sitting or lying on.

SPECIES	HOUSING AND SPACE REQUIREMENTS (if caged)
Guinea Pigs	Guinea pigs can tolerate a wide range of temperatures if acclimatised (12-20°C). Unless hutches are on stilts and very well insulated it is advisable to move hutches indoors or into a shed during colder winter months. A mobile run that can be moved around the lawn in better weather is most ideal for access to fresh grass. <u>Minimum</u> space requirements are 0.2m ² per guinea pig. Bedding can be wood shavings, straw or hay or shredded paper.
Hamsters	Must have an enclosed nesting area containing hay, shredded paper, wood

	shavings or commercial wadding. Do not use cotton wool. Keep at 19-23°C. Avoid brightly lit and noisy areas. Due to fighting it is preferable to house hamsters singly. Supervise pairs closely if breeding and then remove the male. Cages should be easy to clean and cleaned every 1-2 weeks depending on number of animals and amount of soiling. Exercise wheels and toys and tunnels for activity must be provided.
Rabbits	Minimum floor space is 0.2m ² per rabbit but for rabbits over 2kg an extra 0.1-0.2m ² per kg body weight should be provided. Rabbits should be able to lie at full stretch and the hutch or cage should be tall enough for them to stand up tall on their hind legs. Hutches should be checked daily to see if they require cleaning out.
Poultry	For hens permanently enclosed in a hutch or coop there must be <u>at least</u> 600cm ² usable floor space per bird and perching space of at least 15cm per bird. There must be an indoor nesting/roosting area. One nest box per 7 birds is the minimum, more is recommended. For more information for larger flocks DEFRA (UK) have recommendations for laying hens.
Caged birds	The bigger the better. An aviary is always better than a cage. No cage should be so small that a bird cannot fully stretch its wings and its tail should not touch the floor when perched. For most birds the cage should be well off the floor and only have mesh on 1-2 sides so the bird does not feel vulnerable. A variety of non-slip perches and toys should be provided.

4.2 Handling and Restraint

Animals should be handled in a manner appropriate for their species.

All pet owners should make themselves familiar with specific handling and restraint methods for any pet animals they own.

No animal should be handled, treated or restrained in a way that causes unnecessary pain, distress or suffering.

5. Management Practices

5.1 Mating

Animals should be mated only when they have reached a sufficient size and maturity.

Pet owners must familiarise themselves with the specific husbandry requirements of a pet having a litter and must be prepared to care adequately for the dam and her offspring.

6. Husbandry Procedures - Surgical

6.1 General

All surgical procedures, must be carried out by a Veterinary Surgeon or under the direct supervision of a Veterinary Surgeon apart from non-invasive procedures such as trimming of nails and grooming practices.

6.2 Identification

It is good practice to have dogs and cats identified with a microchip.

7. Health

Sick, injured or diseased pet animals should receive prompt attention by an experienced person or veterinary surgeon.

8. Euthanasia

Pet animals must be destroyed humanely by a veterinary surgeon or an experienced operator with a free bullet gun.

Response to the Public Accounts Committee

Mr Speaker, I would firstly apologise to the House for the delay in the response to the PAC's letter of the 27 April 2017, which was presented to the House under Motion 12/17, this was an administrative oversight.

Further to the letter from the chair of the Public Accounts Committee (17th July 2017) I can confirm that PWD are progressing recommendations made on both the Morrison-FIG partnership and the PWD Tender & Contracts.

The partnership document has been reviewed and updated by both parties. There were delays due to changes in FIG senior management and proposed changes to the procurement process. These have now been agreed and the revised document is progressing and will be considered by ExCo for approval in July 2018. All the recommendation raised within the audit and the PAC are addressed in the proposed new agreement.

The Tenders & Contracts report listed six un-actioned items. Of these six items, three have now been completed and the remaining three are in progress. It is expected that all items will be satisfactorily completed by December 2018. Documents such as the PWD procedures manual and the project initiation document are live documents and will remain under regular review.

Mr Speaker, Executive Council have requested that the Director Public Works reports back in 6 months on progress in respect of the outstanding three recommendations, this will then be reported to the House.

Motion Number 19 of 2018 by the Honourable Teslyn Barkman

Response to the Public Accounts Committee

Mr Speaker, the Review of the Sea Truck Procurement from the Public Accounts Committee was presented to the House under Motion 17/17 in December 2017.

Four recommendations were included in the report as follows:

PAC Recommendation 1

“Where departments are not intending to go out to tender for procurement they should clearly state this in any ExCo paper and dispensation should be sought from the Treasurer”.

Agreed

PAC Recommendation 2

“In future where third parties are requested to oversee projects, a formal contract should be agreed setting out the roles and responsibilities for each party.”

Agreed

PAC Recommendation 3

“Where projects are delivered late FIG should consider if the relevant penalties in the contract should be applied. If penalties are not sought a note should be recorded to justify why late delivery penalties should not be applied”.

Agreed, provided that there are penalty clauses for late delivery incorporated within the contract.

PAC Recommendation 4

“FIG should request performance information from WSL in accordance with the contract covering all aspects of the contract. Regular contract monitoring meetings should be held between FIG and WSL.

It is assumed that this recommendation refers to the Workboat Services Ferry & Coastal Shipping Charter Party Contract which is not related to the procurement of the Sea Truck. For the record, since the receipt of the PAC report (August 2017), FIG receives monthly performance statistics from the contractor, cargo delivery statistics and compliance with published sailing schedules. The Charter Party contract stipulates the parties should meet “twice yearly” but FIG communicates regularly with Workboat Services and regular meetings are held to review operational requirements, contract performance matters and general issues to be addressed.

1. SUMMARY

This report:

- (a) provides information on United Kingdom laws which have been made between 1 May 2018 and 30 June 2018; and
- (b) makes recommendations about the application of United Kingdom laws to the Falkland Islands (recommendation for **no change**)

The Legislative Assembly is invited to pass a resolution approving the recommendations of this report, in the form set out in Schedule 2 to this report

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 Section 25 of the Law Revision and Publication Ordinance 2017 provides that the Statute Law Commissioner must regularly report to the Legislative Assembly about the application of United Kingdom laws; ordinarily monthly. The last report was made to the Assembly on 1 June 2018 in respect of UK laws made between 1.4.18 and 30.4.18.

2.2 United Kingdom laws apply to the Falkland Islands by two routes; (a) by direct application by decision of United Kingdom authorities; or (b) by adoption by decision of the Falkland Islands (through the Law Revision and Publication Ordinance 2017).

2.3 The purpose of monitoring United Kingdom laws and reporting on them is to enable the Legislative Assembly to understand what United Kingdom laws have been made during the reporting period. The report identifies which laws apply to the Falkland Islands directly by decision of the United Kingdom authorities, and in respect of the adoption of UK law by the Falkland Islands, the report enables the Assembly to determine:

- (a) whether any changes made to UK laws which have been adopted by the Falkland Islands should continue to apply in the Falkland Islands (ie where such changes automatically apply to the Falkland Islands under the Law Revision and Publication Ordinance); and
- (b) whether any new UK law which does not apply in the Falkland Islands should be adopted by the Falkland Islands.

2.4 In the reporting period, 8 Acts have been passed, and 243 statutory instruments made.

3. UNITED KINGDOM LAWS PASSED OR MADE IN THE REPORTING PERIOD

3.1 Section 25 of the Ordinance provides ten categories of United Kingdom law which must be separately listed in this report. Those categories, and the relevant United Kingdom laws under them, are set out in the paragraphs below.

3.2 Paragraphs 3.4.1 to 3.4.6 provide information concerning the application of United Kingdom law to the Falkland Islands by decision of United Kingdom authorities (directly applied law).

3.3 Paragraphs 3.4.7 and 3.4.8 provide information concerning the application of United Kingdom law to the Falkland Island under the Law Revision and Publication Ordinance 2017 (adopted UK law).

3.4 Paragraphs 3.4.9 and 3.4.10 provide information about other United Kingdom laws, ie in terms of potential application to the Falkland Islands.

3.4.1 List each UK Act passed in the reporting period which provides expressly, or by necessary implication, for the Act's extension to or application in the Falkland Islands:

No Act of this type has been passed in the reporting period.

3.4.2 List each UK Act passed in the reporting period which provides for the Act's extension to or application in, the Falkland Islands by Order in Council:

(a) *Nuclear Safeguards Act 2018 – c 15*

This Act creates a legal framework to ensure that the United Kingdom is able to continue to meet its international nuclear non-proliferation and nuclear safeguards obligations after leaving the European Union.

The Act provides that it may be extended to any British overseas territory by Order in Council. There are not known to be any immediate plans to so extend the Act to the Falkland Islands (and it seems unlikely to be necessary).

(b) *Sanctions and Anti-Money Laundering Act 2018*

This Act enables the UK to implement sanctions, both that the UK is obliged to implement as a member of the UN, and those that the UK might choose to implement for its own foreign policy purposes, after leaving the European Union.

The Act provides that it may be extended, in part, to any British overseas territory, together with any order/regulations made under it. There are not known to be any immediate plans to so extend the Act to the Falkland Islands. Historically, sanctions imposed by the United Kingdom have been extended to the British overseas territories by Order in Council.

(c) *Space Industry Act 2018* (CORRECTION to April 2018 report)

The passing of this Act was noted in the report of 16 April 2018 considered by the Assembly on 26 April. The report listed the Act under paragraph 3.4.10.

However, the Act provides that it may be extended to a British overseas territory by Order in Council, so should have been listed under this paragraph of that report. There are not known to be any immediate plans to so extend the Act to the Falklands Islands (and it seems unlikely to be necessary, at least on the foreseeable future).

3.4.3 List each UK Act passed in the reporting period which amends the extension to or application in the Falkland Islands of an Act described in the paragraphs above:

No Act of this type has been passed in the reporting period.

3.4.4 List any Order in Council made in the reporting period providing for a UK enactment [ie Act or instrument] to extend to or apply in the Falkland Islands:

No Order in Council of this type has been passed in the reporting period.

3.4.5 List any statutory instrument made in the reporting period under a UK Act which amends a provision which extends to or applies in the Falkland Islands by virtue of express provision of the enabling Act or of an Order in Council, where the amendment also extends to or applies in the Falkland Islands by virtue of express provision of the enabling Act or of an Order in Council, or by necessary implication:

(a) *The Armed Forces (Flexible Working) Act 2018 (Commencement) Regulations 2018 (SI 2018/799)*

These regulations bring the Armed Forces (Flexible Working) Act 2018 into force on 30 June 2018. The regulations extend to the Falkland Islands by implication on the basis that the Act applies in the Falkland Islands (as reported to the Assembly in March).

(b) *The British Nationality (The Gambia) Order 2018 (SI 2918/620)*

This order amends Schedule 3 to the British Nationality Act 1981 to add the Gambia to the list of countries whose citizens are Commonwealth citizens. The order extends to the Falkland Islands by implication on the basis that the Act applies in the Falkland Islands.

3.4.6 List any other statutory instrument which has been made in the reporting period under a UK Act and which extends to or applies in the Falkland Islands by virtue of express provision of the enabling Act or of an Order in Council, or by necessary implication:

The Immigration and Nationality (Requirements for Naturalisation and Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2018 (SI 2018/618)

These regulations amend Schedule 2B to the British Nationality (General) Regulations 2003. The effect of the amendment is that certain categories of persons applying for British Citizenship under the Windrush Scheme are to be taken to have sufficient knowledge of English and of life in the United Kingdom for naturalisation purposes. The principal regulations apply in the Falkland Islands by implication, so the amendments also apply by necessary implication.

The Statute Law Commissioner has reviewed the 243 statutory instruments made in the reporting period (and also one statutory instrument made in a previous reporting period, which was not published until after the previous relevant report was produced).

For ease of reference all instruments considered are listed in the Schedule to this report.

In respect of the potential for any of the instruments to be adopted by the Falkland Islands, the Commissioner makes **no recommendation**. That is largely because the instruments either have no immediate relevance to the Falkland Islands or are made in respect of areas where the Falkland Islands has its own distinct policies and laws.

However the Commissioner has alerted the relevant FIG Directorate in the following cases (as highlighted in bold in the Schedule):

- (a) where new UK laws have been made which develop United Kingdom policies from which Falkland Islands law has been very clearly drawn; or
- (b) where the new UK law is made in an area where there is a clear legislative gap in the Falkland Islands but which cannot immediately be filled (for practical or other reasons) by adoption of the relevant UK law.

This will enable policy consideration about whether recommendations should be made as part of the Government's legislative programme in due course to change the relevant law in the Falkland Islands.

4. RECOMMENDATIONS IN RESPECT OF UNITED KINGDOM LAW PASSED OR MADE IN THE REPORTING PERIOD

4.1 Section 25(5) provides that the Statute Law Commissioner must make a recommendation as to whether an amendment should be made to Schedule 1 of the Law Revision and Publication Ordinance, in respect of each UK enactment listed under paragraphs **3.4.7 to 3.4.10** above (whether that recommendation is to provide for application of the relevant law to the Falkland Islands, for exclusion from application, for modification, or otherwise).

4.2 The Statute Law Commissioner recommends that **no change** be made to the law of the Falkland Islands.

4.3 The reasons for each decision behind the recommendations are set out below

4.3.1 Enactments listed under 3.4.7 – None listed

4.3.2 Enactments listed under paragraph 3.4.8 – None listed

4.3.3 Enactments listed under paragraph 3.4.9

(a) Data Protection Act 2018 – c 14

This Act repeals and replaces the UK's existing (1998) data protection laws with the intention of keeping the laws up to date in the digital age, in which ever increasing amounts of personal data are being processed. The Act sets new standards for protecting personal data, in accordance with recent EU data protection laws (General Data Protection Regulation (EU 2016/679)), giving people more control over the use of their data. The Act also makes provision for the UK's intended departure from the EU.

The Falkland Islands currently does not have any law which makes comprehensive or significant provision in respect of the protection of personal data.

There is a common law duty of confidence which applies in the Falkland Islands, and some statutes, such as the Taxes Ordinance and Statistics Ordinance, impose duties of confidentiality in respect of some personal data. These provisions work together with section 9 of the Constitution (which provides protection for private and family life, and for privacy of home and other property; in particular correspondence) to give some protections around personal data. However, those protections might be regarded as minimal, and there appears to be good argument for the Falkland Islands to implement a Data Protection Ordinance. This was recognised as long ago as 1995 with the introduction of the Data Protection Ordinance 1995, but which was never brought into force (due to a failure to make the regulations under it necessary to implement the law). The Ordinance was subsequently repealed in 2012 because it had never been given effect to and, in any event, reflected substantially out of date UK data protection laws (being based on the Data Protection Act 1984).

It is not recommended that the Data Protection Act 2018 be adopted in the Falkland Islands; at least not immediately. That is because detailed policy consideration needs to be given to

whether the Act's provisions are all relevant and appropriate for the circumstances of the Falkland Islands (eg What resources would be appropriate to regulate/enforce the law in the Falkland Islands? Are the relevant regulatory burdens on business proportionate and achievable for the Falkland Islands?). On this basis, the Act has been drawn to the attention of the Director of Development and Commercial Services, the Director of Policy and Economic Development, and the Attorney General, in order that consideration can be given and appropriate recommendations for prioritisation of policy development work.

(b) *European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 – c. 16*

This Act makes provision to repeal the European Communities Act 1972 on the day that the United Kingdom leaves the European Union. The Act ends the supremacy of European Union (EU) law in UK law, converts EU law as it stands at the moment of exit into domestic UK law, and preserves laws made in the UK to implement EU obligations. The Act creates temporary powers to make secondary legislation correcting laws which would no longer operate appropriately once the UK has left the EU. The Act also enables domestic law to reflect the content of an agreement under Article 50 of the Treaty on European Union, subject to the prior enactment of a statute by Parliament approving the final terms of withdrawal.

It is not recommended that the Act be adopted by the Falkland Islands, because it deals with the mechanisms for withdrawal from the European Union of the United Kingdom; in respect of which the Falkland Islands is not a member. The Falkland Islands Government is undertaking a stream of work to consider the potential impact of the withdrawal of the UK from the EU on the Falkland Islands, and the Statute Law Commissioner is available to advise on any particular impacts on the Falkland Islands law in that regard.

(c) *Financial Guidance and Claims Act 2018 - c.10*

This Act makes provision establishing a new financial guidance body, and makes provision about debt advice, about marketing of pension and other financial products and services, and about the regulation of claims management services.

It is not recommended that this Act should be adopted in the Falkland Islands because it makes appropriate provision in respect of a broad and complex financial services industry which does not exist in the Falkland Islands.

The Act has, nonetheless been brought to the attention of the Director of Development and Commercial Services and the Attorney General to enable policy consideration to be given to whether similar, tailored, legislation should be made in the Falkland Islands to provide appropriate protections in respect of the supply of financial guidance and the supply of financial products and services in the Falkland Islands.

(d) *Laser Misuse (Vehicles) Act 2018 – c 9*

The Act makes provision creating new offences of shining or directing a laser beam towards a vehicle or air traffic facility

It is not recommended that this Act should be adopted in the Falkland Islands because the Crimes Ordinance 2014 is intended to provide a comprehensive criminal code; ie where reasonably possible legislation creating crimes in the Falkland Islands should be contained in

that locally made Ordinance. On this basis, this Act has been drawn to the attention of the Attorney General, Chief of Police, and Director of Civil Aviation, in order that policy consideration can be given to whether equivalent provisions should be incorporated into the Crimes Ordinance in due course.

(e) Secure Tenancies (Victims of Domestic Abuse) Act 2018 – c. 11

The Act makes provision about the granting by local authorities of certain tenancies in cases of domestic abuse.

It is not recommended that the Act should be adopted in the Falkland Islands, because the underpinning legislative and operational framework for United Kingdom local authorities and the provision of social housing is not reflected in the Falkland Islands. However, because the Act reflects important protections which can be provided in cases of domestic violence, it has been brought to the attention of the Director of Health and Social Services, the Director of Public Works, and the Attorney General in order that policy consideration can be given to implementing appropriate policies and laws in the Falkland Islands.

(f) Smart Meters Act 2018

The Act provides new regulation surrounding the United Kingdom's Smart Metering Implementation Programme, including in relation to industry regulator Ofgem. The Act is not relevant to the Falkland Islands because of the different way in which utilities are provided in the Falkland Islands (and the Director of Public Works has been asked to confirm that there are no plans to introduce smart meters in the Falkland Islands for the foreseeable future).
